Ayres NNR Nature Discovery Trail

Follow the Trail markers to discover some of the special areas of this National Nature Reserve – there is a map overleaf.

When the Manx Wildlife Trust Nature Discovery Centre is open, you might like to hire a Nature Discovery rucksack – use the contents to help you find out even more about nature! Here are some suggestions but you can use them anywhere on the Trail:

- Beach and dunes special plants. Use the magnifying glass to look closely at the plants. Are the leaves different to your garden plants – they may be thick and waxy for protection from salty air.
- 2. Tower birds. Enjoy the fabulous view and use the binoculars. What are the birds doing are there seals in the water?
- S. Wooden stobs –lizards. Our only reptile is shy so stay still and quiet and use the binoculars to look down the row of stobs it needs to be a warm day, perfect for sunbathing lizards!
- Old sand pit flowers. Sniff them are they scented? Can you see any insects sipping on nectar? Use your bug box to take a closer look but be very gentle!
 - 5. Rabbit warren. You'll probably see rabbit poo rather than rabbits.
 - 6. Standing stone heathland birds. Scan the tops of bushes with your binoculars or listen for calls to help you locate birds.
 - 7. Gorse and wet area birds. Gorse smells a bit like coconut but watch out for spines. You may see different kinds of birds here.
 - 8. Scrub birds. Look out for bugs and butterflies too.
 - 9. Pine tree car park birds. Don't forget to use the notebook to record your finds if you don't know the names of things make one up!
 - **10. Notice Board what have you seen?** We hope you saw some of the plants and animals but remember that Nature changes with the seasons and the weather.
