

## Manx Ornithological Society: publisher of the Peregrine journal of Manx natural history

#### Summary of bird sightings in the Isle of Man, August 2023

**Gadwall** – A pair were at Pooil Vaaish on 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Common Scoter** – The 22<sup>nd</sup> saw 16 in total passing Peel.

**Black-tailed Godwit** – A high count of 15 on the Langness saltmarsh at high tide on 2<sup>nd</sup>. Six were seen there on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Knot** – Regular sightings from Langness and Derbyhaven through the month; though a high count of 26 came on 14<sup>th</sup>.

**Ruff** – Two were present at Stinking Dub on 14<sup>th</sup>, one remaining on 16<sup>th</sup>.

Curlew Sandpiper – A juvenile was seen at Stinking Dub, Langness on 29th.

**Sharp-tailed Sandpiper\*** - A single bird was seen on Stinking Dub, Langness on 14<sup>th</sup>. The same bird as August last year?

**Green Sandpiper\*** – A bird flew from the Langness saltmarsh on 2<sup>nd</sup>. Two were together in a wet field near Ballachurry, Rushen on 7<sup>th</sup>.

**Wood Sandpiper\*** - An individual was present at Stinking Dub, Langness on 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**Greenshank** – Singles were seen at Derbyhaven and Langness through the month; three were recorded from Langness on 2<sup>nd</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Common Tern\*** - Four birds were seen off Peel on 19<sup>th</sup>. A single bird was also seen there on 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**Arctic Skua** – Off Peel an individuals were seen on 7<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup>. A dark phase bird was seen offshore from Rue Point on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Leach's Petrel\*** - At least three were seen off Peel through the day on 19<sup>th</sup>.

**Kingfisher** – An individual was reported from the River Neb at Peel on 10<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Osprey** – A bird was seen soaring over Cregneash on 6<sup>th</sup>. Another individual flew south past Langness on 16<sup>th</sup>. The 29<sup>th</sup> saw an individual off the Marine Drive, and later presumably the same individual on the Calf.

**Tawny Owl\*** - Reported as being heard at the Lhen on 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Redstart sp.** – Reported as Black Redstart, a female Redstart was reported from a Douglas garden on 27<sup>th</sup>.

**Spotted Flycatcher** – Three were seen along the River Neb near Peel on 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Garden Warbler** – A single bird was seen at Ballachurry on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Whinchat – An individual was seen near the Point of Ayre on the morning of 26th.

### Calf of Man Interesting Sightings, August 2023

**Common Scoter** – 3<sup>rd</sup> saw 26 birds seen during seawatches. Four were also seen on 20<sup>th</sup>.

Swift – Only one seen in the month on 18th.

**Common Sandpiper** – Eight sightings of single birds during the month, the last on 29<sup>th</sup>.

Arctic Skua – A single sighting on 13<sup>th</sup>.

Storm Petrel – Recorded on nine days through the month; a peak of 16 on 16th.

Great Shearwater\* - A single bird was seen during a seawatch on 11th.

Osprey – Three sightings of individuals on 6th, 29th and 31st.

Swallow – Southbound passage is underway, a high count for the month being 286 on 8th.

Melodious Warbler\* – A single 'atypical' bird of a grey & white form was caught and ringed on 16<sup>th</sup>.

Grasshopper Warbler – A single was caught and ringed on 15th.

**Spotted Flycatcher** – Return passage began though only single birds recorded on six days from 13<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Pied Flycatcher\*** – Two were recorded on 25<sup>th</sup>, and a single on 29<sup>th</sup>.

Whinchat – One record a single bird caught and ringed on 26th.

**Tree Sparrow\*** - Five birds were recorded together on 30<sup>th</sup>.

Tree Pipit\* - Recorded on 11 days during the month; a high count of five on 9th.

Species marked with \* are yet to be considered by Manx Bird Records Committee.

Please note that sightings of sensitive breeding species may not be included in this summary during the periods outlined at <a href="http://manxbirdlife.im/sightings/start-and-end-dates-for-sensitive-breeding-species/">http://manxbirdlife.im/sightings/start-and-end-dates-for-sensitive-breeding-species/</a>.
