

# Manx Ornithological Society: publisher of the Peregrine journal of Manx natural history

### Summary of bird sightings in the Isle of Man, July 2023

**Pochard** – A probable juvenile was at Glascoe on 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Gadwall** – Two eclipse plumage birds were present at Langness on 24<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.

Common Scoter – Off Peel three were seen on 12<sup>th</sup>; and 17 on 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Black-tailed Godwit** – A single bird was seen regularly at Stinking Dub through the month. A single bird overflew Pooil Vaaish on 27<sup>th</sup>; and three were together at Derbyhaven on 31<sup>st</sup>.

**Green Sandpiper\*** – One flew from East Kimmeragh Dub, Bride on 8<sup>th</sup>.

**Pectoral Sandpiper\*** - A single bird was present at Stinking Dub, Langness from 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>; only the second Isle of Man record.

**Greenshank** – There were several records from Langness and Derbyhaven including a single at Langness on 17<sup>th</sup> and two in Derbyhaven on 26<sup>th</sup>. Peel saw a singles on 9<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Knot** – The 24<sup>th</sup> saw a single bird at Langness; and later three in Derbyhaven. On 26<sup>th</sup> one was still present at Langness.

**Mediterranean Gull** – Several Peel sightings with two on  $4^{th}$ ; then single birds on  $5^{th}$ ,  $9^{th}$ ,  $12^{th}$  &  $18^{th}$ . Ramsey bay saw a  $1^{st}$  summer bird on  $8^{th}$ . A breeding plumage adult was in Garwick Bay on  $9^{th}$ . Strandhall saw individuals on  $8^{th}$  and  $27^{th}$ .

**Common Tern\*** - Two birds were seen at Rue Point on 10<sup>th</sup>; and another two were seen overflying Langness on 24<sup>th</sup>. Three were seen off Peel on 18<sup>th</sup>.

Arctic Tern - Individuals passed Peel on 8<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. A single bird was in Derbyhaven Bay on 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Storm Petrel** – Off Peel a high count for the month of 11 following a trawler on 26<sup>th</sup>.

Swift – Castletown saw the highest counts during the month with 29 on 19th, and 22 on 31st.

**Spotted Flycatcher** – One was reported from Port Soderick on 6<sup>th</sup>; while another individual was seen in Regaby on 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>. Two adults were seen feeding young in Lonan on 16<sup>th</sup>.

### Calf of Man Interesting Sightings, July 2023

Manx Shearwater – 1696 flew south off Culbery in 2hrs on 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Cuckoo** – A single bird was recorded on 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Buzzard** – Three young fledged. The first successful breeding attempt for the Calf.

**Greenshank** – A scarce bird for the Calf, a single was recorded on 27<sup>th</sup>.

Storm Petrel – Recorded on six days through the month; a peak of 18 on 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Sedge Warbler** – The 24<sup>th</sup> saw 21 individuals recorded; the highest July count on record.

Grasshopper Warbler – An individual was caught and ringed on 24th.

**Great Spotted Woodpecker** – A juvenile was caught and ringed on 9<sup>th</sup> and remained until the 20<sup>th</sup>; only the 14<sup>th</sup> Calf record.

**Crossbill** – A single was recorded on 25<sup>th</sup>.
